Anita Hardon is Professor of Health and Social Care at the Faculty of Social and Behavioral Sciences (Sociology/Anthropology Department) and currently Dean of the Amsterdam School for Social Science Research (www.assr.nl), both at the University of Amsterdam. After graduating in medical biology she did a PhD on medicine use and self-care among poor in Manila at the Department of Cultural Anthropology/Non-Western Sociology at the University of Amsterdam and worked for several projects on drug use. More recently she has become more involved in research in the field of gender and reproductive health. Anita Hardon has an extensive research experience in the field of health and development as well as interdisciplinary collaboration.

Starting off from the topics of pharmaceuticals, sexual and reproductive health and interdisciplinary health research, this MAS colloquium aims at discussing with her the general role of medical anthropology in global health: How can medical anthropologist work together with other researchers? What can medical anthropologists contribute to interdisciplinary/transdisciplinary research projects in their own countries as well as abroad? How can medical anthropology best bring in its values, methods and contents in such projects?
